President's Message

Happy New Year Fellow Skalleagues – I hope 2010 is starting out well for all of you.

At the SKAL Congress in Budapest I attended in November I brought home a wonderful album which details some history I would like to share with all of you. As you know SKAL International celebrated it's 75th anniversary this past spring, having been founded in Paris in 1934, by amongst others, Florimond Volckaert. As you are well aware we donate monthly to a fund set up in his name to help Skalleagues having financial difficulties. By the way, did you ever wonder how a Frenchman got a name like Volckaert? I did and he was actually born in Belgium, but lived, worked and died in Paris.

But Skal didn't happen overnight. It all actually started in 1932 when a new aircraft was being introduced for the Amsterdam-Copenhagen-Malmo route. Airlines involved were Farman, KLM, and A/B Aerotransport – who's managing director, Capt. Carl Florman asked his rep in Paris, Hugo Krafft, to gather up 14 travel agents and take them on what today would be called a "Fam trip". They were very well received in Copenhagen and learned the toast "Skal"- then proceeded on to Stockholm for more toasts. They were having difficulty with the Scandinavian languages but all agreed that one word was easy to remember – "Skal" - and it became associated with their camaraderie.

Upon their return to Paris Hugo Krafft gathered up 34 colleagues to form a tourism club and they decided to name it Skal after their good time in Scandinavia. Florimond Volckaert was one of the five founding members of the Paris Club - along with Krafft. During the next year word was spreading about the organization and a second club was formed in Antwerp promoted by George Thiry of American Express, followed by 10 other clubs. He was a friend of Volckaert and the idea of an international club was born. All 12 of the original clubs were involved in what was called the "Association International des Skal Clubs" or A.I.S.C. - which today we know as Skal International – and formed April 28, 1934. Three of the five founders of the Paris Club became founders of A.I.S.C. and Florimond Volckaert became the founding President – a position he held until 1939. Managing Director Captain Carl Florman served on that board from 1935-1938.

Wouldn't you know that an airline guy – a few travel agents – and am sure some hotel folks and tour operators could figure out how to have a good time!

My thanks go to Skal historian and one of our Honorary Presidents, Antonio Garcia del Valle of Spain for his input on the book, and for answering my questions

The original SKAL stands for – believe you've seen this before:

- S sundhet health;
- K karlet friendship;
- A alderdom long life;
- L lycka happiness.

Perhaps I'll try it that way at the next meeting – Jan 28, 2010 6:00pm at Outrigger Reef on the Beach – see you all then.


