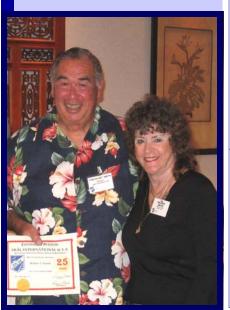

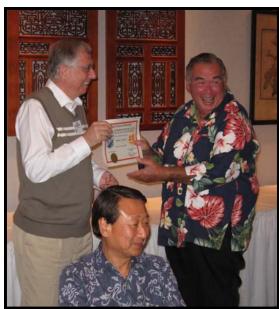












# Young SIAL
